On November 14, 2020, Janet Marie Kachuriak went home to be with our Lord peacefully at her home in Prosper, TX at the age of 65, surrounded by her family after a 17-month battle with pancreatic cancer. She was born April 9, 1955 in Cleveland, OH to Bill and Arlene Gaab. She was the beloved wife of Ron, loving mother of Timothy (Rebecca) and Christopher (Michelle), cherished grandmother of 6 grandchildren and 5 great-grandchildren, beautiful sister to 4 siblings, and fun-loving aunt to numerous nieces and nephews.

Jan was the most incredible wife, mother, grandmother, sister, and friend anyone ever had. She poured her life into the people she loved and gave of herself even in her final days. She was best friend to many, and the Nana kids dream to have. Married to her best friend, Ron, for 44 years, she always made her husband her top priority—forsaking all others to fulfill her role as his partner in life. Her devotion to her husband and her marriage spurred in her a passion to minister to young married couples and young women about God's gift of marriage. Jan was a prayer warrior and a student of God's word. She was an example of a godly mother to her own children, teaching them each day what it looked like to follow Christ and loving them fiercely. Her grandchildren truly were her crowning glory, and she cherished every day she spent with them, making memories constantly, cooking for them whenever she could, always making sure they knew how deeply loved they are by her and by the Lord. Her entire life was devoted to showing the love of Jesus to everyone she came in contact with. She served in so many different ministries over the years, always unselfishly and with passion. When her children were young, she helped start the Pregnancy Resource Center of the South Hills and led Bible studies out of her home for young girls. Later on, she served in the Apples of Gold ministry, women's Bible studies, and the marriage ministry at The Bible Chapel. When she was diagnosed with cancer, she jumped in with two feet to her new mission, sharing God's love with people at the cancer center. She said she knew that it was God's new job for her because in order to be with them, she needed to have cancer. She accepted this mission with grace and felt privileged to be entrusted with it. She truly "walked the walk". Jan will be missed by so many of us on this side of heaven, but we rejoice with her, knowing that she is now

hearing the words, "Well done, good and faithful servant."
