Alice Faye Roberts, 81, of Pilot Point, TX, passed away Thursday, July 23, 2020 in Pilot Point, TX. Fay was born August 8, 1938 in Shreveport, LA to Harold Duard and Monte Pauline (Pritchard) Reddin. She married Gene Roberts on June 20, 2000 in Pilot Point, TX.

Fay and her former husband had a ranch in Broaddus, TX called Wildwood Farms. She managed the farm - including breeding, raising, and selling horses - while her former husband and son worked off shore. Fay raised a World Champion Stud. She sent and worked with lots of horses throughout the United States and Venezuela.

On their ranch in Pilot Point, TX, Gene and Fay raised, bred, and sold several World Champion horses as well as many horses from all over the United States, Mexico, and Canada. Together they owned and operated the Horse Country Lodge Bed & Breakfast in Pilot Point. They served people from all over the world—Vietnam, Russia, Australia, Brazil, Italy, Germany, Sweden, England, Canada, Switzerland, Mexico, and Venezuela to name just a few. The guests became friends and would continue to return over the years.

Fay is survived by her husband, Gene of Pilot Point, TX; two sons, Kevin Doolin and wife Karen of Lufkin, TX and David Roberts of Lewisville, TX; daughter, Sheryl Pierce of Waco, TX; granddaughter, Zoie Doolin of Gainesville, TX; two grandsons, Jesse Doolin of San Antonio, TX and Dakota Medlin of Waco, TX; and brother, H. D. Reddin and wife, Kathern of Montgomery, TX.

She was preceded in death by her parents, Harold Duard and Monte Pauline Reddin.
