Bobby Calvin Redfearn, 86, of Aubrey, TX, passed away Sunday, October 13, 2024. Bobby was born in a dirt floor house on May 27, 1938 in Aubrey to Harvey Deck and Vernie E. (Hendricks) Redfearn. He married Diana Lynne Allen in Denton, TX on May 5, 1985.

Bobby was born a peanut farmer and continued farming until the drought of 1980. He was a great trader and was known as Big Bob the Horse Trader. He bought and sold chickens, cows, horses, tractors, trailers, and anything to make a profit. Bobby could make you think that what he had to sell was the best. He also bred and raised hundreds of excellent horses.
