Brooklynn Faith Fellure, 22, of North Las Vegas, passed away on July 4, 2022, after a car accident.

Brooklynn was born on January 24, 2000, to Christopher and Lisa Fellure at Travis AFB, CA. Brooklynn was the youngest daughter. Brooklynn had a smile that would light up a room. She loved her dog Mochi. Brooklynn was kind, caring, compassionate and always wanted to help others. After Brooklynn graduated from Choctaw High School in 2018 with her high school diploma and also an Associates Degree in Science, she went on to join the United States Air Force.

After graduation and attending her father's retirement from the United States Air Force, she said, "Dad, I want to make a difference like you," and decided to join the Air Force... like her father. 19 Jan 2019 she started her Air Force career, despite being cut short she was an accomplished woman for such a young age. She completed basic training as an Honor graduate. From there she went onto Tech School for her job in Aerospace Propulsion. Completing Tech School as a 3 level/F-16 Propulsion Systems Apprentice. Her first and only duty station would be Nellis AFB, Nevada where she would be assigned to the Viper Aircraft Maintenance Unit, 57th Aircraft Maintenance Squadron, 57th Maintenance Group, 57th Wing. Quickly she attained her 5 level/F-16 Propulsion Systems Journeyman and a 2nd Associates degree from the Air

Force in Applied Sciences. She deployed in support of Operation ALLIES WELCOME, charged with assisting Afghan arrivals with resettlement support services as they begin to rebuild their lives in the United States. Her efforts during this deployment led to her being selected for the Air Force International Affairs Excellence Award. This is an Air Force level award and a major accomplishment.

Her selflessness was the center of who she was and her guiding light in life. She was projected to complete her Bachelor's degree in Fire and Emergency Management in 2023. In 2022, Brooklynn graduated from Basic EMT course. Brooklynn was planning to further her paramedics qualification and possibly go to the Firefighter Academy. Helping others in need was always her ultimate goal.

Brooklynn is survived by her parents, Christopher and Lisa Fellure; sisters, Rhiannon Fellure and Meckennah Fellure; grandparents, Joe and Kathy Fellure of Lone, CA; grandmother, Terri Powers (David) of Haslet, TX; grandfather, Clifford Sims (Denise) of Dublin, TX; many loving aunts, uncles, and cousins; and her niece.

Memorial services will be held at Slay Memorial Funeral Center, 400 S. Hwy 377, Aubrey, TX on July 23rd at 1:00 pm. Following the service please join us for a reception at the First United Methodist Church, 12465 FM 428, Celina, TX.

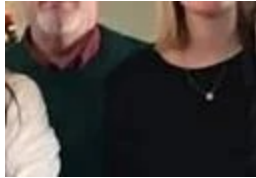

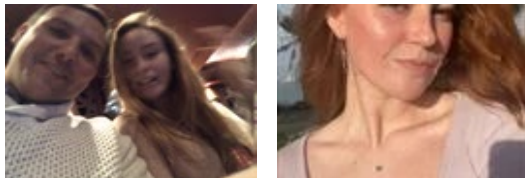
