Curtis Denver McCullough, 62, of Aubrey, went to be with his Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, on Friday, Oct. 10, after a long battle with COPD. He was born in Denton, Texas on May 13, 1963, to Robert Earl McCullough and Barbara Jeanette (Crouch) McCullough. He attended Aubrey and Pilot Point schools and was a member of Calvary Baptist Church in Pilot Point. He married Queta Marie (Hodge) Nave on July 1, 2011, in Denton.

Curtis worked in a variety of careers, but he was well known by family and friends for being a bass guitar musician. He loved band in high school and got his start semi-professionally by playing at local church events with his father's gospel group, "The Crossroads Quartet." Through the years, he also played and sang backup vocals with various local country music bands and occasionally sang lead vocals. He found even more passion as a musician when he gave his life over to the Lord and began participating in leading the church congregations in praise and worship.
