Cynthia “Cindy” Ann Olson, 60, of Pilot Point, TX, passed away Thursday, March 11, 2021 in Denton, TX. Cindy was born July 22, 1960 in Denton, TX to Daniel Thomas and Glenda Lounell (Cooper) Boerner. She graduated from Pilot Point Selz High School in 1978 where she was involved in band, drill team, basketball, volleyball, 4H, and FFA/FHA.

She served multiple times as the PPHS Band Booster president and served in other band booster officer positions. She was also a supporter of Bearcat moms. Cindy supported her boys and nephews and nieces through everything they were involved in. She was employed by Victor/ESAB in Denton for 42 years with her most recent position as the Accounts Receivable Supervisor. She was a lifelong member of St. Thomas Aquinas Catholic Church in Pilot Point where she was an avid volunteer, choir member and CCD teacher.

Following in the footsteps of her father, Daniel, and grandfather, W. F. Boerner, Cindy served Branch 13 as a branch VP beginning in 1995, then she took the President role in 2001 and was still in that role until her death. She became a District Director in 2018 and in that position, she was Chairman of the Investment Committee. She loved her work with Catholic Life.

According to her sons, their mom was always loving and giving no matter who you were or what you did. She would always go out of her way to help. She

was their biggest cheerleader. Cindy felt her greatest accomplishment in life was being blessed to be Mom to Tad and Trevor. Nothing else made her prouder.
