It is with heavy hearts that we remember Danny Ray Redfearn, 65, of Aubrey, TX, who passed away Monday, October 20, 2025.

Danny was born March 26, 1960, in Denton, TX to Billy Ray Redfearn and Mary Francis Arrington. He married Sharana Shield July 3, 1982, until her passing January 3, 1999. Danny married Debbie Lee Fipps in Whitesboro, TX in 2019.

In June of 1983, Danny welcomed his first son, Danny Ray II into the world, followed by his second son, Kyle, in October of 1984. The joy of fatherhood was evident in every moment he spent with his boys.

dedication. A true patriarch and proud grandfather, he went on to carry the values he'd laid out for sons, onto his grandchildren- every moment he could.

Danny found peace in the quiet moments spent by the water, fishing. He loved nothing more than sharing these experiences with his family, creating memories that will be treasured forever.

At the time of his passing, Danny was still baling hay, a true exemplification to his unwavering work ethic and connection to the land he loved.
