Eva Jean Cunningham, 87, of Houston, passed away on Thursday March 20th, 2014 at Bayou Manor Nursing Center. Eva Jean was born May 28, 1926, in Celina, TX to Lee Van and Jessie Pearl (Garrison) Cunningham.
