



## Gladys Dorothy Schwartz

July 25, 1928 - July 13, 2020

Gladys Dorothy Schwartz, (known to her family as Dotsy) of Denton, TX, passed away Monday, July 13, 2020 after a short battle with Covid19, at the age of 91. She was born July 25, 1928 in Cameron, TX to James Walter Harris and Ella Dorothy (Boenker) Harris. Dorothy married Albert Charlie Schwartz on June 23, 1956 in Houston, TX.
