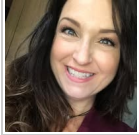

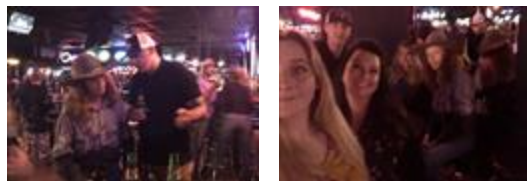

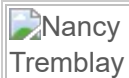


“ *Ian. You were amazing and unique and so handsome and that hair just Wow. Prettier than any girl I know.*
