



## Jeffrey Randall Judy

Jeffrey Judy passed away on October 2, 2022, after experiencing cardiac arrest in Houston, TX. He was born on May 29, 1987, as the oldest son to James Randall and Cindy Marie (Huelskamp) Judy. He was born in Naperville, IL and lived in Batavia, IL until his family moved to Scottsdale, Arizona in 1997. Jeffrey was an avid member of concert and marching bands from elementary school through college. He graduated from Pinnacle High School in Phoenix, AZ in 2005 then attended and graduated from the University of Arizona in Tucson, AZ. After graduation, he worked as a counselor for two colleges then got a job at Southwest Airlines. 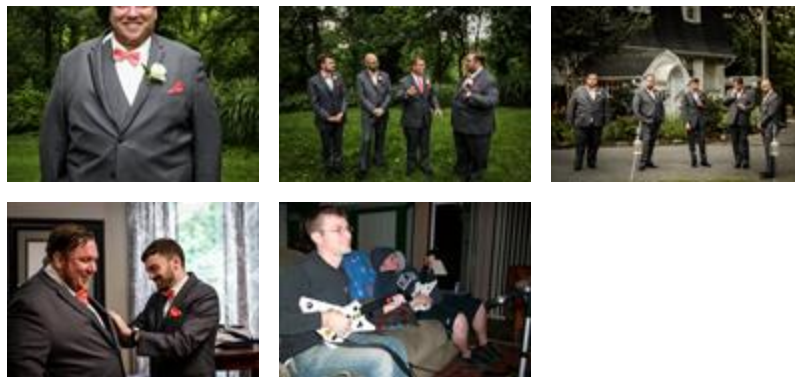
