Leta M. McCabe, 41, affectionately known as Megan or Skyler, from Denton, passed away Tuesday, January 23, 2024. She was born July 27, 1982 in Roswell, NM.

Megan was a spirited child and pursued military service from early childhood. She joined the Civil Air Patrol in the sixth grade and went into JROTC. Megan lettered in ROTC throughout high school. Upon graduation in 2000, she entered the USAF where she served honorably for 15 years with numerous commendations, and letters of appreciation for her service and volunteerism.

Following her devoted military service, Megan enrolled in the engineering program at the University of North Texas and graduated with dual degrees. In the years since, Megan was employed with the Sports Clips franchise where she worked with a fantastic team, often saying that she had found her “Best Fun Job” as she called it.

During all these years, Megan held very close ties with her community. She often would hand her coat to a homeless person, fed countless strangers, and installed wheelchair ramps and grab-bars for the infirmed.

Megan volunteered at the Boys and Girls Club, Girl Scouts, Habitat for Humanity, and was always first to help her family or anyone in need.

Megan was a light and joy to everyone who knew and loved her. We mourn her deeply and hold tight every memory close to our hearts. Although the family feels a tremendous sense of loss without Megan, we know how great her love for each of us was and we will enjoy sharing great memories of Megan for many years to come.

She is survived by her daughter; her mother; 3 siblings; her grandparents; and numerous nieces, nephews and cousins.

Megan will be placed to rest at the Dallas Fort Worth National Cemetery with military honors on Friday, February 23, 2024 at 10:30AM.
