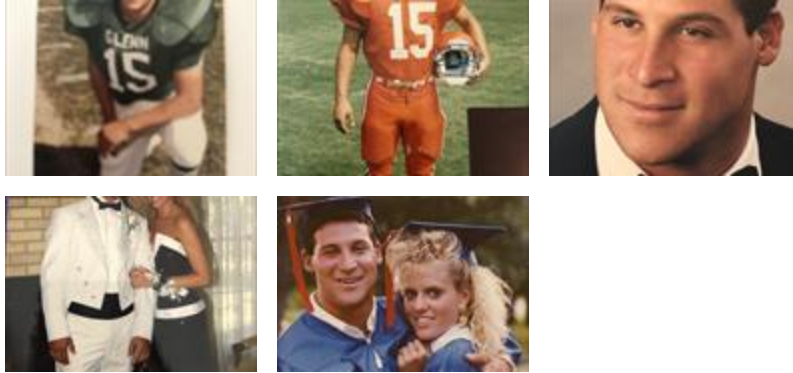
You will be forever loved, missed and remembered every day.
