Michael John Lemery, 44, of Oak Point, TX, passed from this life on Friday, December 3, 2021 following a lengthy illness.

Michael was born May 23, 1977 in Glens Falls, NY to John Lemery and Deborah (Courville) Bazinet. He graduated from Glens Falls High School in 1995 and enlisted in the United States Navy in 1996. Mike was a sonar tech on the USS Asheville from 1996 to 2001 and he proudly served in the Navy until he was honorably discharged in 2010.

Michael met the love of his life, Jane, in 2011 while working in Louisville, KY. In 2012 the couple joined Toyota and moved to Georgetown, KY. His love of Toyota led him to buy his FJ Cruiser and join the Tri-State Cruisers, a Cincinnati, OH area off roading club.
