Mike Tischler, 89, passed away on July 24, 2022, surrounded by his family at his daughter's home in Krum, TX. He was born to Louis and Tillie (Fritcher) Tischler on April 18, 1933 in Tioga, TX.

Mike served in the Army from 1953 to 1955, during the Korean War, and was stationed in Germany. He retired after 43 years from Aviall/Ryder as an aircraft mechanic rebuilding carburetors. Mike was a member of the Knights of Columbus and the American Legion, and life-long member of St. Thomas Aquinas Catholic Church.
