Paula Jean "Jeannie" Berend Snow peacefully passed on June 10, 2025, surrounded by lots of love after a 9-year battle with cancer. She fought and beat cancer, but at a cost that robbed her of so much.

Jeannie was born on May 13, 1948, in Denton, TX and was raised in Pilot Point, TX. Jeannie was the middle child and only daughter of Lawrence "Lonnie" Louis Berend and Anna Nadine "Nick" Riney Berend. Jeannie had a wonderful childhood and talked about many of her favorite stories, people and memories until her last days.

One of her most beautiful stories was about her husband, Henry "Hank" Wayne Snow. Hank and Jeannie were high school sweethearts that were separated by war and time, but neither were enough to keep them apart. She never missed a sporting event; sitting in the bleachers watching football, volleyball or tennis was her happiest and she never failed to be standing at the door with her famous grimace as they both walked in past curfew, which

But the greatest joy of Jeannie's life was her grandchildren, who even on her darkest days made things better.
