Shirley Joy Smothermon, 88, of Prosper, TX, passed away Saturday, March 22, 2025 in Prosper. Shirley was born September 8, 1936 in Celina, TX to V. C. and Pauline (Griffin) Spradley. Shirley married the love of her life, Grady Len Smothermon in Prosper on January 29, 1955.

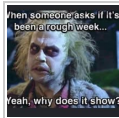
