Tammy Lynn (Worthy) Armor, 57, of Forestburg, TX passed away Saturday, October 12, 2024, in Denton, TX. She was born on June 26, 1967, in Denton, TX to Willam "Bill" Robert Worthy and Lois Blackburn Worthy. She married Jimmy Doyce Armor on November 15, 1991, in Aubrey, TX.

At the age of 12, Tammy was diagnosed with Type 1 Diabetes. Oh, don't worry, it didn't slow her down!

Back in the day, Tammy and Kim Branch would go trampling through the

woods in Krugerville, before a lot of the current streets existed. She soon got her license, and then her first car. Tammy always came up with an excuse to go to Keno's to meet up with her life-long friends, Cynthia, Darlene, and Sabrina. I am sure they were cruising the strip in Denton and driving all the boys crazy! Haha! I'm not positive, but I'm pretty sure!

When Tammy turned 20, she gave birth to her baby boy, Chris. They were inseparable. They went through a lot together and she loved him so much! At the age of 22, Tammy welcomed her baby girl, Megan, who quickly became a daddy's girl. She married me, the love of her life, on November 15, 1991. We started our lives together living in the Aubrey/Pilot Point area, before moving to Granbury in 1996. There, she was able to be a stay-at-home mom. We also gained a son, Jeremy, and he's a keeper! Then, we were blessed with Paisley, and oh man, what a doll she is, and she was crazy for her Nana! It gets better! We now have two more grandbabies, Ana and Ariel, as well as a daughter, Cory.

After the kids were grown, the lake life was born. Tammy enjoyed being out on

the boat and getting some sun! She spent the majority of her time there for several years and built friendships that truly became family. Chad & Amanda, Steve & Robin, Roger & Cynthia, Tracy & Diana, as well as their kids, are forever in her heart!! She had tons of friends, with way too many to mention. Mike & Darla, David & Lita, James & Cinda, Steve & Darlene, Sabrina, Kirk, and Linda are just a few. As we all say, those were the good old days! Let the good times roll!

In February 2022, Tammy had a major stroke. The doctors informed the family that she wouldn't make it, but they didn't know how tough she was! Tammy knew God still had a plan for her!
