Virginia Nell Kyle, 89, of Arlington, TX, passed away Saturday, July 11, 2020 in Arlington. She was born February 26, 1931 in Holtville, CA to Alford and Connie Ellen (Young) Mayfield. Virginia married Kenneth Dearld Kyle on August 30, 1947 in Anson, TX.
