“ *September 8 at 1:03pm Last night my grandmother, Waletta "Billie" Ellis, passed away, surrounded by her children and her husband of 64 years. She was 84. As the family story goes, Grandma was born in a tarpaper shack in the middle of a snow storm in South Dakota during the Great Depression. The doctor broke her arm while delivering her. He told her mother that she wouldn't survive the night, so my great grandmother put the infant in a shoebox and placed it under the wood-burning stove to keep her warm for the night. Boy did my grandmother prove that doctor wrong. She was one of the hardest working people I've ever known. She was a model of perseverance. For the last few years she had an ongoing correspondence, via handwritten letters, with my daughter. Her biscuits and gravy were the gold standard by which all other comfort food must be judged (none of it quite measures up). We miss you already, Grandma. And we love you.*
